SOCIETY NAME CHANGE: The membership officially voted at its November 27, 1978 meeting to change the name of our organization from the Pascack Genealogy Society to the Bergen County Genealogy Society. It was agreed that the new name reflects the membership and its interests more accurately.

Back in 1971 a group of 10 people who completed an Adult Education course in genealogy began meeting informally as the Pascack Genealogy Workshop. In January 1973, the Workshop became a formal organization. In 1974 the name was changed to the Pascack Genealogy Society.

The purpose of the Bergen County Genealogy Society is twofold: (1) to provide family tree researchers in Bergen County (N.J.) and nearby environs with a forum for mutual assistance and a sharing of research experience; (2) to encourage the preservation of local and family history by the public. This is accomplished primarily at monthly meetings normally held on the fourth Monday at 7:30 P.M. at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 840 Soldier Hill Road, Emerson, N.J. Other activities include The Archivist (a

quarterly newsletter), a genealogical library, field trips, an Ancestor Index and special projects.

RESEARCH HINTS AND SUGGESTIONS

Surname indices on LDS microfiche are now available for viewing at the Morristown (N.J.) Mormon branch library. Additional microfiche readers also are expected in the near future as the LDS Genealogical Society is in the process of putting all of its surname indices on microfiche. This will be a tremendous help to all researchers. For example, an index of a surname will indicate which records in the LDS system has information on that surname, including geographic locations. (per Gloria Wanamaker)

Robert P. Baker, 269 N. Main St., Milltown, N.J. 08850 offers a service called PDQ Search which provides "a search of the dozens of published indices of U.S. Federal census records now available in private and public collections ..." "PDQ provides the counties and pages in which you may find your subject...." With this information "you can reel to the pages indicated and read off the official data as recorded by the census taker." He also indicates which censuses and states PDQ has in its own collection of indexes. The search for one full name for one state for one census normally is \$2.00.(per George Crede)

An 8-page brochure "The Colt Family in Paterson" was put together in 1977 by the Jerseymen of Paterson Catholic Regional High School (N.J.). It was available through the New Jersey Bank. PERSONAL NOTES

Ted Obal has been trying to locate a maternal first cousin of his wife. Reportedly, she lived in Berlin and married an Austrian. All he had was her father's pre 1970 address in Poland. But the father was deceased. In December 1974 he wrote to that old address hoping that he might be lucky. But there were no answers and it looked like the end of the road. Then suddenly out of the blue, just before Christmas 1978, he received a letter from Poland from the youngest daughter of the deceased father by his second marriage. She happens to be a half sister to the first cousin that Ted is trying to locate. She was not aware of Ted's original inquiry but wrote because his address was forwarded to her by other relatives. He immediately wrote back and is now anxiously awaiting her reply.

Maria Hopper will never forget Monday, August 14, 1978 and Westerly, R.I. While on a family camping trip on the Rhode Island shore, she decided to visit the Westerly library only 20 miles away. Her husband dropped her off around 8:45 that Monday morning, with a promise to return after lunch. Before he left she checked the sign on the door which said the library would be open from 9 A.M. to 9 P.M. By 9:30 the library still wasn't opened. Something was wrong. Spotting a postman delivering mail, she asked if he knew why the library was still closed. "Sure", he replied with New England pride, "Rhode Island is the only state in the union that still remembers August 14 as VJ day." Maria now strongly advises to Call Ahead First, especially if you "don't enjoy spending a hot summer morning lugging a heavy briefcase while window shopping in a town full of closed stores". She did manage to visit the library briefly the next day. It had a small genealogy section which was particularly good on Rhode Island and New England ancestry.

RESEARCH HINTS AND SUGGESTIONS

If you are tracing ancestry in Holland, try writing the provincial or district archive nearest your ancestral location. One New Yorker recently wrote the Groningen Archives (Gemeentearchief Groningen, Viaductstraat 3a, 9725 BG Groningen, Netherlands) and asked for vital info on his paternal grandfather. He not only received key data on his paternal grandparents but also on a set of greatgrandparents and a set of greatgreatgrandparents - all for only \$7.00 and within two months of his initial inquiry. He soon will be receiving data beyond this from another archive for about \$19. (per Ted Obal)

The International Tracing Service (ITS) headquartered in Arolsen, West Germany, has assembled since 1945 about 40 million card files on some 12 million Europeans who either died in or survived Nazi concentration camps and/or labor camps. 60 to 70% of the names on file are Slavic or Eastern European. An "alphabetic-phonetic filing system" was developed to cope with the many spelling variations. (from Bergen Record, March 18, 1979)

PERSONAL NOTES (per Muriel Wassmann of Emerson, N.J.)

For years I wondered about the noted birth of a great grandfather, James Crankshaw, in the Crankshaw family Bible. It said he was born 7 March 1834 in Twinsburg, Ohio. His father, William was born in England in 1809. I knew nothing more except the facts about James and his wife, Arzelia Vanderhoef, after they were married. What were they doing way out there on the frontier at that time? Who could I write to in Twinsburg for help?

Finally, I decided to try my luck with the Twinsburg Borough Hall and ask for a librarian's name, a town historian or an historical society. As they only had a population of 4000, I doubted there was the latter.

Approximately two weeks later I received a letter that started with "Dear Cousin" and was written by Mabel Crankshaw Culhan. She proceeded to give me dates of family births and deaths, dates of William Crankshaw's naturalization (in Newark, N.J. no less!) and records of his brothers and sisters I did not have. She said she "had heard of Uncle James in the East, but that was all." Her father Samuel and James were brothers!! Her genealogy was listed along with her birthdate. (She was 90 years young in May 1979.)

To say that I was excited was putting it mildly! A lively correspondence followed and I received further information on the Crankshaw burial site and the old homestead, built about 1824 which still exists.

My letter had reached the Borough Hall, was given to the Chamber of Commerce at a meeting and then turned over to Leland Zahniser who was present. As it turned out, he was President of the Twinsburg Historical Society at the time and his mother-in-law was the "Crankshaw" I was trying to find! How's that for luck?

In Sept. 1978, after a six week rest from double knee surgery during the summer, I could contain myself no longer. My husband and I found our way to Twinsburg, Ohio (425 miles). I bet we travelled a lot faster than my great grandfather did.

The story continues with many interesting pieces of family history starting to fit together, and I have started a chronological calendar of events.

With the help of a remarkable lady called Mabel who shows all the traits of a "true Crankshaw", I will someday have a family history to leave behind which will include more than just names and dates.

PERSONAL NOTES (per Ted Obal)

My paternal grandmother Victoria Zmuda remarried at age 57 in Nebraska about a year after my grandfather John Obal died in Illinois. For years all I knew about her mother (my greatgrandmother) was that her first name was Mary. I had no clues on her maiden name. Attempts to find a record of her birth and her first marriage (both in Poland) were unsuccessful. So were inquiries to older relatives in Poland.

I thought I was at a dead end for this line until this summer when my sister-in-law in Illinois (who caught the genealogy bug from me 3 years ago) presented me with a record of my grandmother's second marriage (the one in Nebraska). And there on the certificate were her parents names, including my greatgrandmother Mary Sturske (possibly Sturski). It proved again that one should not overlook any documented record, even if you think the chances for a find are slim.

By the way, my sister-in-law obtained the copy by the simple method of writing the Nebraska Bureau of Vital Statistics together with the usual moderate fee.
