1. An Open Door to History, a new 40 page guide to Bergen Co., N.J., historic sites, is available for \$3.00 a copy from the County's Office of Cultural and Historic Affairs, 355 Main Street, Hackensack, N.J. 07602. (Make checks payable to Bergen County, N.J.) It offers detailed information on each historic map plus a centerfold map pinpointing the 27 sites. Also available from the same office are copies of the American Revolution Bicentennial Map of Bergen County for \$3.00 each. (from the Record 12/12/82)
2. The National Archives are in the process of reviewing bids from private contractors to operate a census microfilm rental program on a fee basis. Libraries that borrowed the film in the past will be notified when the new program is operational (probably around mid 1983). NICHOLAS LOZIER DESCENDANTS - On page 71 of the Schraalenburgh Church records (Holland Society, Volume 1, Part 11), there is a baptism of Marytje, the daughter of "Nikolaas Lesier and Antje Banta". One of the witnesses was David Davidze Demaree. As Nicholas had another daughter Maritje, who was baptized 11 May 1701 in Hackensack, this first Maritje must have died. The first Maritje married in 1721 David Davids Demarest, who was one of the witnesses to the second Maritje's baptism. Also, in these records there is a published banns of David Demarest, widower of Marytje Lesier, to Catherina Van Houten, of Tappan, 08 January 1729. You would think that this would clinch this one. The abstract of Nicholas Lozier's will, written in 1745, he indicates Mary as "begotten by first wife" which blows our theory to pieces. But, then in 1745, old Nicholas was 77 years old and might have been confused or senile. This second Marytje would have been his 19th child when she was born and the old man himself 60 years old by then. The only thing we can conclude is that Nicholas was a bit mixed up. With that many children running around through all those years, plus grandchildren, no wonder he was confused. (per John F.W. Minke III)

to any member of a legally incorporated genealogy society" (ex-  
cerpt from Chap. 93, Sec. 7-41a, p.533). In general, copying of  
such records for genealogical purposes is limited primarily to  
those vital records "which relate to events which occurred prior  
to the year 1900" (excerpt from Chap. 93, Sec. 7-51a, p. 538).
