MEETINGS: The next regular meetings will be held on March 25 and April 22 at 7:30 P.M. at the Hillsdale Public Library, 509 Hillsdale Ave., Hillsdale, N.J. The public is invited to all meetings.

PROGRAMS: Katherine Randall of Hillsdale and Margaret Casey of Hackensack, both members of our Society, discussed "Resources at the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society Library" at the February meeting. On March 25 Jessica Peters and Anita Zalinski of the Passaic County (N.J.) Historical Society will talk on the "Resources of Passaic County Historical Society in Lambert Castle". They are in charge of the collections there. On April 22 John Spring of Cresskill, N.J. will present a slide show entitled "The Palisades Through the Years". He will talk of the history from geological time to the present, noting families who were important in preserving the Palisades.

The committee welcomes additional surnames at any time. The index may be used by sending one dollar and a stamped, self-addressed envelope. If the names you are researching are in our index, the names of the members who have submitted these surnames will be sent to you.

Members who have not sent in the surnames for the Index and are willing to answer queries can participate by sending in a 3" x 5" card for each surname together with the general areas, i.e., county, state, country. This info should be typed or printed in the upper left side of the card. The name of the member should be on the lower right side of the card. An additional "member" card should be included with the member's name and address in the upper left side.
