U.S. PASSENGER ARRIVAL LISTS

(In the National Archives, Washington, D.C., unless otherwise noted.)

A. 1820 Legal Requirement

Starting in 1820, passenger arrival lists were required to include name, age, occupation, name of ship, port of arrival, and port of embarkation. However, there are many gaps for the 1820-1945 period. From 1790 to 1820 less than 1% of the records are available. During the 1800's passenger arrival records were not required for persons entering the U.S. by land from Canada and Mexico.

B. What Lists the National Archives Has

Inbound ship passenger arrival records for most East Coast and Gulf Coast ports back to 1820 and a few lists for Philadelphia that go back to 1800. Lists for Pacific Coast ports, if they exist, are not in the custody of the National Archives.

C. Indexes of the Following Passenger Lists

Baltimore 1820-1952; Boston 1848-91 and 1902-20; New Orleans 1853-1952; New York 1820-46 and 1897-1943; Philadelphia 1800-1848; and minor ports 1820-74 and 1890-1924. The National Archives will search the indexes if you supply the following info: (1) full name of passenger, (2) port of entry, and (3) approximate date of arrival.

D. Passenger Lists With No Index

The major list with no index is New York 1847-1896. To search un-indexed lists, the National Archives requires more information than for the indexed lists. E.g., for pre 1893 lists they additionally require either the name of the vessel or the port of embarkation. For lists after 1892, they need (1) port of entry, (2) name of the vessel, (3) exact date of arrival, (4) full name of passenger, and (5) names and ages of accompanying passengers, if any.

E. Address to Write to in Washington, D.C.

Reference Services Branch (NNIR), National Archives and Records Service, 8th and Pennsylvania Ave., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20408.

1. Request NATF Form 81 (ask for more than one copy).
2. Complete NATF Form 81 and mail in. The form has space for name of the immigrant, date of arrival, port of entry, ship's name (or carrier line), passenger's country of origin and where naturalized (the latter if known).
3. Do not forward payment with NATF Form 81. National Archives will bill you after completing the search. You will have 30 days to make payment.

U.S. NATURALIZATION RECORDS

A. Naturalization after Sept. 1906

The Immigration and Naturalization Service has a Master card index of all files created since Sept. 27, 1906. The public cannot search these indices. But a request for a search can be made through Form G-641. (The fee was \$5.00) Address is: Records and Information Branch, Immigration and Naturalization Service, 425 Eye St., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20536.

B. Early Records - Before Sept. 1906

Determine the name of the court where the papers were filed. Also, determine where the records of that court are now stored. (or, try Immigration and Naturalization Service thru Form G-641.) Many records before Sept. 27, 1906 were transferred to Federal Records Center (National Archives and their regional branches). Some may be in state archives or in various court houses. For a possibility of courts and court houses (local, county, state, etc.), see Chapters 5 and 6 of Neagles, Locating Your Immigrant

Ancestor. It has a detailed survey of location of such records, if any. Also, See Chapter 3 of Genealogical Research in The National Archives, 1983 edition, for a good description of naturalization records by state that are in the various regional Federal Archives Record Centers (FARC).

C. Records for New York City (1792-1906)

1. Photocopies of Naturalization Records.

Records consist of 5" x 8" photographic copies of naturalization documents filed in Federal, State and local courts located in New York City. They are grouped by name of court and are arranged thereunder numerically by volume or bundle number, and by page or record number.

2. Card Index to Naturalization Records.

A card shows the name of the individual naturalized, the name and location of the court which granted the Certificate of Naturalization, the volume (or bundle) number and page (or record) number of the naturalization record, and may include other information in the naturalization papers.

B. Veterans Who Served During or After World War I

1. Write to National Personnel Records Center (Military Records), GSA, 9700 Page Boulevard, St. Louis, Mo. 63132 for forms and instructions.
2. For genealogical requests ask for GSA Form R6-7231. For other inquiries ask for Standard Form 180, "Request Pertaining to Military Records". (Note: These form nos. may have changed.)
3. Restrictions of Records. Information from these records can only be released with the written consent of the Veteran, or if deceased, the next of kin.
Requests from family members are restricted to a limited number of relatives, such as the father, grandfather, brother and uncle.

IRISH PERSONAL ADVERTISEMENTS (1831-1916) (New Info)

Personal Advertisements placed by Irish immigrants or members of their families in the Boston Pilot from 1831 to 1916 are being compiled by two Northeastern University professors, Ruth Ann Harris and Donald M. Jacobs. They will be published as a series entitled "The Search for Missing Friends" by the New England Historic Genealogical Society and the Northeastern University Irish Studies Program.

The first volume, scheduled for publication this spring, is a catalogued index of 4,993 advertisements that appeared in The Pilot from 1831 to 1850. Future volumes will catalogue 35,000 more of the advertisements that ran in The Pilot until 1916.

The Pilot was one of the largest and most influential Irish-American newspapers in the U.S. Many Irish immigrants placed these personal ads in the hope of finding relatives and friends who preceded them to the U.S. According to Mrs. Harris, a majority of the notices were placed by brothers and sisters searching for their siblings. Many of the ads gave a lot of facts about both the seekers and the sought, e.g. surname, sex, age, physical description, occupation, Irish county of origin, port of entry and intended destination. This is the type of information that could be valuable to both family tree researchers and historians.

The ads suggest that Quebec City was second only to New York City as a port of entry for Irish immigrants. Boston, surprisingly, shows up as a distant third among Irish ports of entry in North America, according to Mrs. Harris.
