BERGEN COUNTY CEMETERY INVENTORY PROJECT

A survey of all pre-1930 cemeteries in Bergen County, N.J. is underway by the Bergen Co. Division of Cultural and Historic Affairs. Local historians, preservation commissions, and genealogical and historical societies are being contacted for information on locations and histories of cemeteries in their communities. A "Cemetery Inventory" form will be used to record key data and descriptions of church cemeteries, isolated burials, as well as family

Carl Brostrom of Bergenfield, N.J. has compiled a listing of burials in the South Church Cemetery, Bergenfield, N.J. through 1988. The list has over 1000 names. It includes relationships, e.g., husbands, wives & minor children. It also ties in to available family genealogies.

has from 1900 onward. The 1st floor Vault includes deeds, grantor & grantee indexes, mort-
gage records with indexes, civil and criminal actions, adoptions, trustees, maps, Ulster Co.
censuses for 1905, 1915, and 1925. Also early church incorporations and WWII service
discharges. (Note: Newburgh, which is in Orange Co. now, was in Ulster Co. through the
1700's. Its land records, etc. for that period are in Kingston.) (per Marion Armstrong)

A PERSONAL EXPERIENCE IN SWISS GENEALOGY by George H. Wettach, Fair Lawn, N.J.

My name, WETTACH, is of Swiss origin and rather uncommon. In my travels here and abroad I always look for the name, and certain others, in local telephone directories. I started when fairly young and, as a result, made some interesting contacts. E.g., one Wettach was a pioneer in Alaska and had many tales to tell.

Through a listing in a Swiss telephone directory, I met a detective in St. Gallen (Switzerland) and his family. His ancestors had lived in the same area for 600 years. He also was a genealogist. My branch had left St. Gallen many years ago, possibly during the Reformation, as all the St. Gallen Wettachs seem to be Catholics and all the Bern Wettachs seem to be Protestants who came to Bern, Switzerland, via Baden, Germany. His uncle, a doctor and also a lifelong genealogist, has estimated that their branch were 15th cousins to GROCK, the famous Swiss clown who was born Charles Adrian Wettach and who is my 4th cousin.

In June 1988 my wife and I met some 5th cousins in Brienz (Bern) and hopefully stirred up their interest in genealogy. While looking up other Wettachs in the hotel's telephone directories (noted 18 books for the whole country), I got the idea that maybe I could locate some old directories that were no longer needed.

On our return home, I contacted the Swiss Consulate General in New York to see if they could suggest a source of discarded Swiss telephone directories in this country. (I was thinking of the Consulate itself or possibly one of the multi-national companies with Swiss connections.) They suggested, however, that I contact the headquarters of the Swiss Postal System (PTT).

The PTT suggested a printout of the name Wettach as it would be easier and cheaper than sending 18 directories. Since there were other Swiss names that I was interested in, I offered to pay the mailing costs of any old directories. Their reply, however, was a complete printout of 79 Wettach telephone subscribers with their addresses and, in some cases, their occupations. They also mentioned that all old directories are immediately recycled.

The list is very interesting. It includes Wettachs in both the German speaking and French speaking areas of Switzerland. Three of those listed I had met personally in the course of various trips to Switzerland. I will be contacting the others in the near future.

I don't know if the Swiss PTT would do this for others or if they would charge for it. My list was sent without charge. I plan to suggest to them that they consider instituting such a service at a moderate cost per name or per page.

OTHER GENEALOGY PARTICIPATION

Ted Obal of Hillsdale, N.J., gave a talk on "Polish Genealogical Research" at the May 23 meeting of the Rockland County (N.Y.) Genealogical Society held in New City, N.Y. On July 3 he was interviewed and taped on "Polish Genealogy" of Stephen Conte's cable TV series on "Family History".
