**Martha Ann Zabriskie's
Memorandum Book**

Martha Ann Zabriskie (1814-1838), of Saddle River, N. J. (dau. of Garret A. L. Zabriskie and Catherine Westervelt) kept this diary of local events from 1829 until her death, after which her sister, Adaline (who m., in 1855, George Esler) continued it until 1849.

The diary is a running account of mostly local births, deaths, and marriages, with an occasional reference to (usually extreme) weather, unusual local happenings, and national or worldwide events.

The following transcription is made from a typescript transcription of the diary (a copy of which is on deposit with the Bergen County Historical Society).

Some (but not all) of the remarks in parentheses probably were interpolated by the person who made the typewritten transcript. Bracketed comments have been interpolated by this editor.

Events listed should be used with care, as clues, and verified wherever possible by church or other records. It is this editor's experience that while some dates are correct as compared with church records, other dates are off by a few days (perhaps the listing reflects the date of entry in the memorandum book).

Abstract by Tom Wicks

Lucas Van Tienhoven requested the New York State Government to survey 100,000 acres of Orange County land June 20, 1695. The survey described the land in general terms which left it open to future controversies. *The Kakiat Patent...* provides in great detail a historical account of the land and follows later divisions of the original tract. Several family genealogies of early Bergen county families are listed. There are several excellent map reproductions dating back to 1727.

The first index to the History (pp 86-99) is a listing of approximately 330 family names with specific mention noted to various individuals spoken of in Chapters 1-15. Also included are pictures of thirty-nine (39) early homesteads researched by the author who included a descriptive bibliography.

In order to present a more comprehensive picture of the Kakiat lots in Bergen County, Mr. Durie prepared detailed genealogical notes. The genealogies are described as those of, as he stated, highly prolific families, [including] BOGERT, HARING, MABIE, and VAN HORN, while other less prolific families are covered for only the first five generations. The genealogical notes provide additional information on the families of Peter

BOGERT b. 1705, FLIERBOOMs ca 1658, three HARING families ca 1707, the HOLDRUM family ca 1716, the PERRYfamily ca 1660, the PETERSON family ca 1680, and the Lucas VAN HORN family ca 1723.

The concluding index (pp 215-235) lists all individuals (surnames, Christian names) who are mentioned in the Genealogical Notes (pp 140-214). The work of Mr. Durie presents an extremely valuable detailing and developmental analysis of the KAKIAT PATENT OF BERGEN COUNTY.

Gethsemane Cemetery, Little Ferry

In an article in *The Record*, Feb. 18, 1990 by Laurence Chollet, entitled "Old cemetery holds keys to black history," local historian Theodore Brunson noted that several hundred black men and women were interred there between 1860 and 1930.

Gethsemane Cemetery, off Liberty Street near Route 46 in Little Ferry was awarded historic status by the county in 1985. Since that time, archaeological study at the site has uncovered evidence of African burial practices, including burying artifacts with the dead, and decorating graves with such items as seashells, water pipes and broken pitchers.

The cemetery was started in 1860 by three prominent white residents of Hackensack, who designated it as "a burial ground for the coloured population of Hackensack."

Two Civil War veterans are buried at Gethsemane.

Workshop: "Researching Community History"

On Saturday, October 13, 9-3 p.m., a workshop, "Researching Community History" will be presented by the Bergen Co. Dept. of Parks, Div. of Cultural & Historic Affairs in the meeting room of the Community Services Building, 327 Ridgewood Ave., Paramus. The workshop is funded in part by the New Jersey Historical Commission through a grant from the County Block Grant Program.

The workshop will be conducted by Paul Mattingly, professor of history at New York University, who will discuss how to find, analyze, and evaluate historic information. Use of sources such as municipal and county archives, letters, memoirs, diaries, photographs, newspapers, directories, and oral history will be covered.

Old Newspapers Acquired by USR Historical Soc.

A bound volume of issues of a Saddle River and vicinity newspaper, *The Landscape*, found in a Pittsfield, MA bookstore by a book collector from Massachusetts, has been acquired by the Upper Saddle River Historical Society. The collection includes issues from 1882-1888. *The Landscape*, written and published by Alfred P. Smith (b. 1832, d. 1901), a black journalist who lived in Upper Saddle River, contains many items of local genealogical and historical interest. The Society plans to microfilm the collected issues.

LDS Acquisitions: New York City Vital Records

Those interested in vital records of New York City (including Brooklyn, Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens, and Richmond) within the years 1798-1937, should check the appropriate sections of the LDS Family History Library Catalog for updated acquisitions. Most available records fall between the dates of 1866-1916+, but the runs of dates are erratic and vary from borough to borough or county to county. Thus far, more than 4,200 rolls have been microfilmed, and New York City records are still being acquired and processed by the library.

1920 Census Opening

Monday, March 2, 1992 is the date set for the opening of the 1920 census. On that date 17 duplicate sets of the microfilmed census and the Soundex indexes for every state will be made available to the public in Washington and at the 11 regional branches of the National Archives.

The 1920 census was Soundexed under the administration of the WPA in the 1930s.

National Archives at Bayonne Update

The Northeast Regional branch of the National Archives, presently in Bayonne, was originally scheduled to relocate in October 1989, then postponed to October 1990, but the removal date has now been changed to August 1991 at the earliest, and the move may not occur at all.

According to an item in *Forum*, the publication of the Federation of Genealogical Societies, the reasons for the delay are not clear, and the site presently under consideration is 201 Varick Street, in lower Manhattan. The move is on hold while the proposed location is investigated by the National Archives and Records Administration to be sure that the building meets certain requirements, including fire safety, floor load capacity and feasible modification costs.

The Bayonne location of the Northeast Regional Archives (on a military base, in the Military Ocean Terminal), established in 1969, has proven to be underutilized because of inaccessibility by public transportation. The Bayonne facility averages only about 15 researchers a day, as compared with an average of 40 researchers a day at other branches. In addition, there is inadequate storage space in environmentally-controlled stack areas and the site—only about 4 feet above sea level—is subject to flooding.

The Bayonne branch holds more records than any other National Archives facility outside of Washington, D.C. Among the records in Bayonne are those of: the U.S. District and Appeals Court, U.S. Attorney's Office, Customs Service, Coast Guard, Immigration and Naturalization Service and other federal agencies in New York and New Jersey. Bayonne has over 40,000 rolls of microfilm, including U.S. Census records, 1790-1910.

Stevens Family Letters Acquired

The New Jersey Historical Society library has recently acquired several hundred letters pertaining to the Francis B. Stevens family of Hoboken. According to the *Messenger*, the Society's newsletter, the letters date from the 1860s into the 1900s and are personal correspondence between family members and friends. Francis B. Stevens was the nephew of Edwin A. Stevens, the founder of Stevens Institute of Technology. These letters add to the large collection of Stevens family papers already in the Society's holdings.

The New Jersey Historical Society is located at 230 Broadway, Newark, NJ 07104. The library and museum are open from 10-4 Weds.-Fri. and the third Saturday of each month.

Martha Ann Zabriskie's Memorandum Book

Martha Ann Zabriskie (1814-1838), of Saddle River, N. J. (dau. of Garret A. L. Zabriskie and Catherine Westervelt) kept this diary of local events from 1829 until her death, after which her sister, Adaline (who m. in 1855, George Esler) continued it until 1849.

The diary is a running account of mostly local births, deaths, and marriages, with an occasional reference to (usually extreme) weather, unusual local happenings, and national or worldwide events.

The following transcription is made from a typescript transcription of the diary (a copy of which is on deposit with the Bergen County Historical Society).

Some (but not all) of the remarks in parentheses probably were interpolated by the person who made the typewritten transcript. Bracketed comments have been interpolated by this editor.

Events listed should be used with care, as clues, and verified wherever possible by church or other records. It is this editor's experience that while some dates are correct as compared with church records, other dates are off by a few days (perhaps the listing reflects the date of entry in the memorandum book).

Howard I. Durie, Local Historian and Genealogist

We were saddened to learn of the death at Stony Point, NY on 5 August 1990 of Howard I. Durie, prolific author of articles pertaining to Bergen and Rockland Counties and the families who lived there. He was the author of *The Kakiat Patent in Bergen County, New Jersey*, published in 1970, an authoritative work on land records of a large part of Bergen and Rockland Counties, also containing genealogical records of many early settlers. He also published, in 1985, *The Durie Family*, a genealogical project begun in 1940.

He was active in historical societies in Bergen and Rockland Counties, including the Pascack Historical Society. Thirty-five years ago, Durie founded that society's publication, *Relics*, serving first as editor, and later contributing the major story for each edition up until the time of his death.

Outwater Reinterment

According to an article in the Nov 1990-Jan 1991 *Heritage Newsletter*, published by the Bergen County Division of Cultural and Historic Affairs, on July 28, 1990 the remains of Thomas Fransen Outwater, disturbed by vandals in March 1989, were reburied at their original resting place in the Outwater Cemetery in Carlstadt. The reburial was also the occasion of a ceremony organized by Outwater descendants and Outwater's Militia, a reenactment group headquartered at the Garretson Farm County Historic Site in Fair Lawn.

Thomas Fransen Outwater (m. (1) 1686, Tryntje Breesteede; m. (2) 1706 Mettie Pieters; m. (3) 1730 Jeanne Durie) moved from New York to Bergen County in the 1690s, settling at Moonachie. He was a physician and became a Bergen County Freeholder. His grandson, John, was a captain in the Bergen County Militia during the Revolutionary War, and today's Outwater's Militia is a recreation of his company.

Ellis Island Museum

The opening of the Ellis Island Immigration Museum in September was announced by

numerous articles in newspapers and magazines, including photographic essays in both *Life* and *Smithsonian* magazines. Admission to the Museum itself (open 9-5) is free, but there is a charge for the ferry service from either Liberty State Park in Jersey City or Battery Park in New York City. Albany Bureau of Vital Records Closed

An item in the Oct. 1990 *Ulster County (NY) Genealogical Society Newsletter* reports that a *Ulster Co. Society* member who recently made a trip to Albany found the Bureau of Vital Records had been permanently closed on Sep. 20. No public announcement as of Oct. 1 had been made. She was told the records will in future be available only by mail order, and because the Bureau will be staffed by part-time help, the wait would be 3-4 months. According to the article, the records were to be moved Oct. 2 to a Pearl Street facility, and it's a possibility the indices may never again be open to the public. This was done by order of Commissioner David Axelrod. "Buried Genealogy"

Society member Harvey Forrest, now living in Hampton, New Hampshire, sent an informative letter and lists of Bergen County historical and genealogical material that he found in 1975 at the Ridgewood Public Library (some stored in the basement). He mentioned that there is often genealogical information and, in many cases, 3-4 generation (or more) genealogies, in county histories written 75-125 years ago. These "buried" genealogies are not often indexed in card catalogs.

Martha Ann Zabriskie's Memorandum Book

Martha Ann Zabriskie (1814-1838), of Saddle River, N. J. (dau. of Garret A. L. Zabriskie and Catherine Westervelt) kept this diary of local events from 1829 until her death, after which her sister, Adaline (who m. in 1855, George Ealer) continued it until 1849.

The diary is a running account of mostly local births, deaths, and marriages, with an occasional reference to (usually extreme) weather, unusual local happenings, and national or worldwide events.

The following transcription was made by Pat Wardell from a typescript transcription of the diary (a copy of which is on deposit with the Bergen County Historical Society).

Some (but not all) of the remarks in parentheses probably were interpolated by the person who made the typewritten transcript. Bracketed comments have been interpolated by this editor.

Events listed should be used with care, as clues, and verified wherever possible by church or other records. It is this editor's experience that while some dates are correct as compared with church records, other dates are off by a few days (perhaps the listing reflects the date of entry in the memorandum book).
