Response to last issue. The Demarest Hosue that was featured (and pictured) in Arnie Lang's response to Query Q26.3.1a, now rests in Historic New Bridge Landing Park (home of the Bergen County Historical Society) in River Edge having been moved there in 1955/6 from its original site in New Milford. The likely date of its construction is 1794, making it much newer than many people think (or wish). Also, in spite of its common name "The Demarets House", it apparently was built by John J. Paulison who married Altie Ely, daughter of Willaim Ely and Maria Demarest, on April 4, 1794. For more, visit the website of the Bergen Co. Bergen County's Townships and Municipalities - Part 4

Until the middle 1880's, Bergen County was divided into sprawling townships as described in the previous articles in this series. In 1885, the townships were Hackensack, dating from 1693; New Barbadoes, 1710; Franklin, 1772; Harrington, 1775; Saddle River, 1794; Lodi, 1825; Washington, 1840; Hohokus, 1849; Union, 1852; Midland, 1871; Ridgefield, Palisades, & Englewood, 1872; Ridgewood, 1876; and Orvil, 1885. Today, Bergen County is comprised of 70 municipalities - of these, there are 56 boroughs, 3 cities, 2 villages, and 9 townships. What brought this about was ------

"BOROUGHITIS"

Early in 1894, the New Jersey legislature passed a school act which wiped out the former subsidiary school districts and made each township a separate school district. Taxpayers were obliged to pay, pro rata, existing debts of the old districts in addition to all future debts of the township for school purposes. Exempted from this provision were "boroughs, towns, villages, and cities".

A rush was then made to form boroughs, and 26 boroughs were carved from those early townships between January 23 and December 18, 1894. The rush to form boroughs was slowed down (but not stopped) when the legislature quickly passed an amendment to the school act that stated that no borough could maintain a school separate from the township unless there were 400 children within its limits.

Before 1893, a number of laws had been passed by the New Jersey Legislature which enabled boroughs to be formed. The first was in 1878 when the Legislature provided for formation of a borough in a township or part of a township, not to exceed four square miles and a population of 5,000. As we saw in the last issue, only **Rutherford** and **Ridgefield** boroughs were formed as a result of that law. Subsequently, in 1891, an act was passed providing for formation of villages whose population was greater than 300 people per square mile and then **Ridgefield Park** village was formed.

Then, in 1893, an act was passed which brought about the sometimes bizarre borough boundaries that were eventually formed. That act provided that a borough could only have a chosen freeholder if the borough contained a portion of two or more

townships. As a result, most of the boroughs that were formed contained small parts of different townships within their boundaries.

The break up of the townships continued after 1894. In addition to the school issue, discontent increased as regions with factories saw their heavy tax assessments being used to support large townships. These split-ups of the townships continued until 1924, when the number of municipalities reached 70. (However, municipal name changes and a few boundary changes still occurred through 1955.)






This concludes the four-part series; Bergen County's Townships and Municipalities.

Standards For Use Of Technology In Genealogical Research [As] Recommended by the National Genealogical Society

Mindful that computers are tools, genealogists take full responsibility for their work, and therefore they-

learn the capabilities and limits of their equipment and software, and use them only when they are the most appropriate tools for a purpose. refuse to let computer software automatically embellish their work.

treat compiled information from on-line sources or digital data bases like that from other published sources, useful primarily as a guide to locating original records, but not as evidence for a conclusion or assertion.

accept digital images or enhancements of an original record as a satisfactory substitute for the original only when there is reasonable assurance that the image accurately reproduces the unaltered original.

Cite sources for data obtained on-line or from digital media with the same care that is appropriate for sources on paper and other traditional media, and enter data into a digital database only when its source can remain associated with it.

always cite the sources for information or data posted on-line or sent to others, naming the author of a digital file as its immediate source, while crediting original sources cited within the file.

preserve the integrity of their own data bases by evaluating the reliability of downloaded data before incorporating it into their own files.

provide, whenever they alter data received in digital form, a description of the change that will accompany the altered data whenever it is shared with others.

actively oppose the proliferation of error, rumor and fraud by personally verifying or correcting information, or noting it as unverified, before passing it on to others.

treat people on-line as courteously and civilly as they would treat them face-to-face, not separated by networks and anonymity.

accept that technology has not changed the principles of genealogical research, only some of the procedures.

Respectfully, I offer one encessary change to the list of Bergen County Boroughs and an addition to the "Family Tree of Bergen County"s 70 Municipalities", contained in Part 4 (Vol. 27, Issue 1, Feb. 2000). The Borough of East Paterson, founded in 1916 when it seceded from the Township of Saddle River, no longer exists. By public referendum, its residents voted to change the name in November 1972, and establish an identity separate from Passaic County city to its west. The borough legally adopted its new name, Elmwood Park, on January 1, 1973.

The Diaries of Elizabeth Ann (Lizzie) Campbell by Maria (Ree) Hopper

Elizabeth Ann (Lizzie) Campbell , was the daughter of John A. Campbell and Hannah Demarest. She was b.14 Sep 1849 (from diary "14 Sep 1868 today is my nineteenth birthday), in Park Ridge. She was bap. as Elizabeth Ann, daughter of John and Hannah Campbell, at Pascack Reformed Dutch Church. [Church Records give only one date that of $\underline{4}$ Sep 1849.]

She d. 29 Jan 1931, unmarried at her home on Main Street in Park Ridge, and is buried with her parents in the Pascack Reformed Cemetery. She never married. Her obituary said her death "closed the career of the last surviving person to be engaged in wampum making. Her father and his three brothers, and their firm the Campbell Brothers made wampum in a mill at Park Ridge using a drilling machine invented by her Uncle James. The process was a closely guarded family secret. The only existing wampum drilling machine is on exhibit at the Pascack Historical Society in Park Ridge, NJ. The obituary also stated, "Miss Campbell who was 81 years old, one of the oldest residents of Park Ridge, had long been without the use of her lower limbs, but had a happy disposition."



Railroad Retirement Board

The Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) was established in the mid-1930's and has records of those employees who were covered under the Railroad Retirement Act from 1937. The Board has no records of persons who died before its inception, nor does it have records for casual laborers. The Board will provide information from its records on deceased persons for genealogical research. Written consent of the person is required on living persons. The records are maintained by Social Security Number. It is sometimes possible to obtain records without that number if full name and complete dates of birth and death are provided, but identification may still be impossible. There may be a fee. Civil War Income Tax Records

If your ancestor was in the US during the Civil War, another possible source of records can be found in the Civil War income tax records. The Internal Revenue Act of 1862 instituted a tax to pay for the war. This tax was in effect from 1862-1872, and the records are available through the National Archives. This could be particularly valuable if your ancestor owned a business or a reasonable amount of property. Check the *Guide to Genealogical Research in the Nation Archives* (929.3 U58) at a library for film numbers. (Source same as above).

BEWARE NEW GENEALOGICAL SCAM

Halberts of Bath, Ohio, was forced out of business, but apparently they may have moved on to a new location. One wary PSRoots newslist member recently posted information regarding a new firm in Denver going by the name Morphcorp. The cover letter she and others have received comes from Mazwell and Christina <last name varies>. The accompanying, professional glossy flyer received in this instance advertises "The Year 2000 [your surname] Family Yearbook" for \$34.85, a price which includes not only the yearbook, but also a "classic family history" and CD ROM. The genealogical watchdog site (http://www.ancestordetective.com/watchdog.htm) now includes this orgainzation on its caveat emptor list. (Reprinted from PSRoots newslist posting Fri.26, May 2000)

The Diaries of Elizabeth Ann (Lizzie) Campbell by Maria (Ree) Hopper Part Two

Continuing Series

Elizabeth Ann (Lizzie) Campbell, was the daughter of John A. Campbell and Hannah Demarest. She was b.14 Sep 1849 (from diary "14 Sep 1868 today is my nineteenth birthday), in Park Ridge. She was bap. as Elizabeth Ann, daughter of John and Hannah Campbell, at Pascack Reformed Dutch Church. [Church Records give only one date that of 4 Sep 1849.]

She d. 29 Jan 1931, unmarried at her home on Main Street in Park Ridge, and is buried with her parents in the Pascack Reformed Cemetery. She never married. Her obituary said her death "closed the career of the last surviving person to be engaged in wampum making. Her father and his three brothers, and their firm the Campbell Brothers made wampum in a mill at Park Ridge using a drilling machine invented by her Uncle James. The process was a closely guarded family secret. The only existing wampum drilling machine is on exhibit at the Pascack Historical Society in Park Ridge, NJ. The obituary also stated, "Miss Campbell who was 81 years old, one of the oldest residents of Park Ridge, had long been without the use of her lower limbs, but had a happy disposition."



BOOK REVIEW: Ree **Hopper** recently received a copy of the new "The **VAN VOORHEES** Family in America: The First Six Generations" by Florence A. **Christoph**. "I have spent some time with the book and can report that it is well done and very well documented. It is far superior to the 1888 and 1984 versions. It is a large hard covered book, 1028 pages long, easy to read and with a terrific bibliography."

"The book is software generated and as such has some peculiarities of the software such as duplicate entries for those descendants on both mother and father's lines. The index is by page number rather that person number so it takes longer to locate an individual, but the good news is that a person's birth and death years are after their name in the index which helps separate the many people of the same name."

"The various spellings used by members of this family VAN VOORHEES, VAN VORRHIS, VOOR-HEES, VOORHIS, VORHIS etc. are alphabetized under the different surname spellings, however there is also a VOORHEES given name index, arrange in chronological order which helps find the various VORRHEESES regardless of the way they spelt their last name."

"As in all genealogies, I found a few errors, but that is to be expected."
